Lanchester Miners Banner Group

The Fenhall Drift Banner is owned by Durham Miners Association and has been returned to Lanchester under the custodianship of Lanchester Parish Council.

The banner was made in 1960 and carries illustrations of the Parish Church on one side and a Roman Figure and Miner on the other side.

The first meeting of the Lanchester Miners Banner Group took place in July. The purpose of the working group is to agree and co-ordinate the works needed to the banner and raise the necessary funds to enable the work to take place. It is hoped that this will be a community project involving many members of the Parish. The group considered funding opportunities and were surprised and delighted to hear that two very generous personal donations have been promised.

FLOODING – CAN WE HELP?

A group of Lanchester residents has formed a Flooding Action Group to help those whose property has been flood damaged. The group includes Lanchester's County Councillors and members of the Red Cross, Lions, Partnership, Parish Council and all 3 churches. It is working with the County Council's Community Flood Engagement Officer.

By mid July members had visited 72 properties, 36 of which had had flood water inside them.

At present the group is focusing on trying to help those who have suffered damage. Later it will look at ways of trying to reduce the danger of flood damage in the future.
