The Farming group are continuing to meet to develop training and support requirements for the rural community of the Parish and the first information sessions and training days are beginning to be delivered. Work on a Wildlife Audit for Lanchester Parish is well underway with a first draft currently being produced by local volunteers. A series of walks leaflets to describe the heritage of the area are planned and



volunteers have just completed the first surveys of these walk leaflets.

To support the historic audit a series of training visits to the Durham Records Office Archives have taken place with 24 people enjoying the training. Further visits are planned so please get in

touch if you would like to come along to these FREE informal events. An interest in local history is all that is required.

In addition training opportunities in mapping wildlife, wildlife surveying, information sessions in renewable energy and computing are also ongoing. Upcoming training includes: first aid (agricultural workers and lone working), beginners sheep shearing, with new opportunities advertised as they become available.

Local school children are also involved with the project. Projects include the construction of a bug hotel in school grounds, mini beast hunts, egg hatching programme and trips to local nature reserves and farms.

The monthly practical conservation working group has been busy planting hedgerows, undertaking woodland and pond management and helping Lanchester Partnership with their annual clean up of the village. The next event is planned for the 21st May, at Malton Nature Reserve.
