Welcome to Lanchester Parish Council's newsletter. This newsletter is produced quarterly to provide the community with information on the services and activities that the Council provides.

Lanchester Neighbourhood Plan

In February a second topic based questionnaire was distributed in the community to all dwellings and businesses. The questionnaire asked for feedback on a draft vision and objectives under 7 key topic areas and some focussed questions were asked under each topic area. 307 completed questionnaires were received. Some findings from the questionnaire are as follows:

- 96% of respondents strongly agreed or agreed with the draft vision.
- Draft objectives categories included: Housing, Design of New Development, Business & Employment, Historic Environment, Green Spaces & the Rural Landscape, Transport and Travel and Community Assets. Between 89% and 99% of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed with the draft objectives.
- ♦ With regard to the appropriate number of new houses to be built per year over the next 10 15 years, 26% of respondents said none, 20% said up to 5 dwellings, 24% said 6 10 dwellings and 21% said 11 15 dwellings per year.
- Over 89% of respondents were in favour (in principle) of a boundary to the settlement of Lanchester to manage the location of any new housing development.
- Over the last 15 years permission has been granted for approximately 10 12 dwellings per year.
 61% of respondents thought this was about right and 32% of respondents thought this was too much.
- 92% of respondents agreed that the Neighbourhood Plan should draw upon the Village Design Statement to guide the design of new development.

The Conservation Area Appraisal completed by Durham County Council and assisted by volunteers from the community has now been approved by the County Council. The heritage Audit is also nearing completion. The North of England Civic Trust have assisted volunteers in producing the audit which has involved surveying and recording over 200 heritage assets. The Conservation Area Appraisal and the Heritage Audit will provide valuable information for the Neighbourhood Plan.

The next step is to bring together all the information we have gathered to prepare a topic paper for each objective / area which will then produce options to achieve the objectives. A grant of £5000 has been secured from 'Locality' to engage a consultant to assist with this process. A full day workshop took place in July to begin this next stage of the plan.
