215/18 Police Report

The Police report provided by PCSO Lisa Cullen-Jackson was read out which included the following incidents:

- current priority is antisocial behaviour specifically in the area of Deanery View Woods and the rear of the Green School. There have been several reports of youths and young adults congregating in these locations to engage in nuisance behaviour, potential drug activity and setting fires. Additional patrols are taking place.
- On Monday 27 August the alarm was activated at the Spar on Front Street. Officers witnessed an unknown person within the premises who made off from the scene.
- Over the summer holidays Lanchester EP School has been targeted by unknown persons, suspected to be youths, congregating in the school grounds during the hours of darkness. Damage has been caused to the sheds.
- An address in Valley Grove has been targeted several times with plants stolen from the garden.

- (iii) Durham County Council Consultation on Proposal to Remove Street Lights

Members considered the consultation information which proposed the removal of 12 lighting columns between the A691 and Malton. A detailed discussion took place.

A number of residents attended the meeting. The following concerns were raised by them regarding the proposed removal of the street lights (i) Safety issues for young people

(ii) If the street lights are removed then children and young people who have previously walked along this route will need to be driven. This will increase the use of vehicles and a loss of independence for young people. It may curtail the interests/hobbies/work of the young people.

- (iii) The top of the road at the A691 would be dangerous to cross in the dark to access the bus stop
- (iv) There is no footpath along the route
- (v) It will be dark in the winter months both in the morning and afternoon when children and young people are going to school and college
- (vi) One child who is partially sighted and hearing would be greatly affective if the lights were removed
- (vii) Very concerned about the risk of accidents along this narrow road
- (viii) Due to the industrial activity at Malton there are large HGV's using this stretch of road
- (ix) There is the potential to miss the turning off the A691 to Malton in the dark if the street lights are removed
- (x) Aware of drug activity at Malton Picnic area. This area will be more vulnerable to antisocial activities

Resolved - that the Parish Council respond to the consultation and object to the removal of the lighting columns for the following reasons:

- (i) The consultation commenced at the end of August when many people are away
- (ii) The consultation does not include public consultation which means those that are directly affected have not been informed
- (iii) The risk assessment is very basic
- (iv) The removal of the lights will create road safety issues for vehicles and pedestrians
- (v) The road leads to a hamlet at Malton and an industrial area which carries a significant amount of traffic
- (vi) There is no footpath along this route which creates a risk for pedestrians walking in the dark
- (vii) The removal of the street lighting will encourage anti-social behaviour. There is already a history of litter, fly tipping, dog fouling, drug activity, damage to property etc in this area
- (viii) The road will be difficult and dangerous to navigate in the dark if the street lighting is removed
- (ix) There are children and young people who live at Malton. During the winter they may need to walk to the bus stop on Durham Road to get to school / college. Similarly they will need to access the bus for social and work reasons. The removal of the street lighting will create a dangerous environment for these vulnerable young people
- (x) The Parish Council feel the benefits to retaining the street lighting far outweigh the cost of retaining this service

The Parish Council would ask that the current street lighting is maintained.

(iv) Request to spread ashes on the Village Green

Councillors considered a request to scatter the ashes of a past Councillor on the Village Green. The Councillor had served on the Parish Council for many years and provided exceptional service to the Parish Council.

Resolved - that due to the special circumstances and his record of service on the Parish Council that permission is granted for the ashes to be scattered on the Village Green

(v) Lanchester Christmas Lights

Members considered the quotation received from Durham County Council to undertake annual works on the Christmas Lights **Resolved -** that the price of £1,190.00 is accepted

(vi) Lanchester Partnership – Fun Run

Members received feedback on the event in July. The event had run successfully with 200 people taking part in the run. The organisers will start planning next year's event in due course **Resolved -** that the information be received

(vii) Durham County Council – consultation on tree management work on the Lanchester Walk, Malton

221/18 Flooding Events and Flood Alleviation Works (min 187/18)

Members were informed of the following information received from the County Council.

The flood alleviation works include works to the culvert in Woodham Court which will require removal of trees. This work has commenced. Following this a large grated channel is to be installed against the kerb line opposite Woodham Court to intercept runoff coming down Newbiggen Lane. A grated channel is also to be installed across the full width of Newbiggen Lane close to the entrance of Lee Hill Court to intercept runoff coming down Newbiggen Lane.

With regard to the flood event on 2 June the County Council have confirmed that this was a 1 in 185 year event. Typically highway drainage and sewers are designed to a 1 in 30 year event. The scheme in Lanchester is designed to a 1 in 100 year event.
