



Lanchester Parish Council Newsletter

The Parish Council By-Election to fill two vacant seats was held on Thursday 3 February. Five candidates stood and the results were:

BENNETT, Maureen	Independent	344 votes
CLARKE, Malcolm	The Labour Party	473 votes
MULVIE, Catherine	Liberal Democrats	250 votes
MYERS, Alan	The Labour Party	480 votes
REES, David	Liberal Democrats	252 votes



There was a turnout of 28% and Malcolm Clarke and Alan Myers were duly elected.

Village Green Project

Work to improve the village green and increase access, is due to commence at the end of January. Developments include the introduction of a recreational path along the side of the burn, surface improvements to an area beside the church, the installation of a Parish Council information board on the main green and the installation of a circular tree seat on the main green to encourage people to sit and enjoy the beautiful surroundings.

A grant of £15,000 has been funded by CDENT from funds received under the Government's Landfill Communities Fund, from the Premier Waste Management Company. A 10% contribution of £1500 has been made available from Lanchester Dairies. It is hoped that the project will be completed in early Spring and we apologise for any inconvenience caused during the work period.

Locality Map

Despite the terrible weather through November and December, work has started on the Lanchester Locality Map Project. Groups have been set up to discuss and develop projects to support the landbased economy, promote the local historic environment and to produce a record of the wildlife across the Parish.

A group of farmers are discussing ways in which the project could support the rural economy. Initial ideas include researching alternative energy technologies in the face of rising energy costs; sourcing grants to help with winter housing of stock and identifying training requirements.

The historic environment group have begun designing circular walks around the Parish that will take in the rich history of the Parish including the historic estates.

The wildlife audit group have begun gathering together current knowledge of the species and habitats of the Parish and thanks to support from Lanchester Wildlife Group, Durham County Council and the Durham Biodiversity Data Service now have access to a very large pool of records. Training has begun on data entry and volunteers are ensuring that all the information is recorded.

Why not come along and join our monthly conservation volunteer group. The group will be meeting on the fourth Saturday of every month to carry out practical tasks across the Parish and the first meeting will be on Saturday 26th February.

Setting the Precept

The Parish Council had a difficult decision to make in setting the precept following an announcement from Durham County Council that they were removing a £6000 contribution paid in previous years. The reduction will be phased out over two years and equates to 12% of the Parish Council budget.

Lanchester Parish Council has set its precept for 2011 / 12 at £49,390.00 which is an increase of only 2.5 % on this year.

Railway Path Network

The Area Action Partnership (AAP) has appointed d3-associates and Southern Green Landscape Architects to develop a master plan on proposed improvements to the railway path network that runs through West Durham.

The extensive network of paths accommodate cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders and the project is seeking to develop a plan that will tie the paths into communities and act as an excellent place to explore, exercise, have fun and enjoy no matter what age you are. As part of the process, the views of the community are being sought on the area at present and how you think the railway paths network could be developed.
